Sec. 1. CHILD FIND

Lake Granbury Youth Services shall ensure that all children residing within Lake Granbury Youth Service's boundaries who have disabilities, regardless of the severity of their disabilities, and who are in need of special education and related services are identified, located, and evaluated. This requirement applies to all children with disabilities, including:

- 1. Homeless children;
- 2. Children who are wards of the state;
- 3. Children attending private schools;
- 4. Highly mobile children (including migrant children); and
- 5. Children who are suspected of being in need of special education but who are advancing from grade to grade.

20 U.S.C. 1412(a)(3)(A); 34 CFR 300.111(a)(1)(i), (c).

Sec. 2. <u>PRIVATE SCHOOL STUDENTS</u>

Lake Granbury Youth Services shall coordinate with home school districts, who are primarily responsible for consulting with private school representatives regarding the child find process and the provision of special education and related services to children enrolled in private schools within Lake Granbury Youth Service's boundaries.

Lake Granbury Youth Services shall undertake activities similar to those undertaken for public school children and shall complete the child find process for children enrolled in private schools in a time period comparable to that for other students attending the public schools within Lake Granbury Youth Service's boundaries.

Sec. 3. STUDENT RECORDS

After each student is enrolled in Lake Granbury Youth Services, Lake Granbury Youth Services will promptly request all student records from the student's previous school.
