

Sec. 1. STUDENTS WHO TRANSFER WITH AN IEP DURING THE SAME SCHOOL YEAR

a. Texas Transfers

When a student transfers to Lake Granbury Youth Services from another school within Texas, Lake Granbury Youth Services shall provide a free appropriate public education (“FAPE”) to the student. Lake Granbury Youth Services shall provide comparable services as those described in the individualized education program (“IEP”) the student transferred with until Lake Granbury Youth Services adopts the student’s IEP from the previous school, or develops, adopts, and implements a new IEP.

34 CFR 300.323(e); 19 TAC 89.1050(j)(1).

b. Out-of-State Transfers

If the student with a disability transfers to Lake Granbury Youth Services from a school outside of Texas, Lake Granbury Youth Services shall provide the student with FAPE, including comparable services, until Lake Granbury Youth Services conducts an evaluation and develops, adopts, and implements a new IEP.

A new IEP must be implemented within 30 school days from the date the student is verified as being a student eligible for special education services.

34 CFR 300.323(f); 19 TAC 89.1050(j)(2).

If a student transfers from Lake Granbury Youth Services, Lake Granbury Youth Services will furnish the student’s special education records to the student’s new school not later than the 10th working day after the date a request for the information is received by Lake Granbury Youth Services.

Sec. 2. STUDENTS WHO TRANSFER WITH AN IEP DURING THE SUMMER

A student with a disability who has an IEP in place from a previous in- or out-of-state LEA and who enrolls in a new LEA during the summer is not considered a transfer student for the purposes of 34 CFR 300.323(e) or (f) and corresponding state law and/or regulations.

The new LEA must; (1) implement the IEP from the previous LEA in full on the first day of class of the new school year; or (2) must convene an ARD committee meeting during the summer to revise the student's IEP for implementation on the first day of class of the new school year.

Sec. 3. STUDENTS WHO TRANSFER WITH A BIP IN THEIR IEP

A Behavior Intervention Plan (BIP) in a student's IEP must be kept in place upon entry to Lake Granbury Youth Services, however, it can be modified and/or enhanced with compatible aspects of ROP's behavior management system with ARD team agreement.
